1 Executive Summary

The applicant, Burleigh Estate Ltd (BEL), owns a property (Lot 2 DP12169) located at 2280 State Highway 63, approximately 3.3km west of Loddon Lane. BEL holds water permit U100803 to take up to 925 cubic metres of Class B Wairau River water via an intake hole in the Wairau River berm for the irrigation of 18.5ha of pasture and crops. That water permit is due to expire on 1 December 2020. BEL has established a vineyard on that property.

Subdivision by way of a boundary adjustment has also been approved for 5.5ha (Lot 1 LT539379) of adjacent land which will be amalgamated with Lot 2 DP12169. Vineyard is being also established on Lot 1.

The total area of current vineyard is 20.5ha.

The applicant also proposes to develop more vineyard on 19.7ha of adjacent accretion land lying between their land holdings and the Wairau River and to irrigate that area. The total area of vineyard eventually will be 40.2ha.

The same maximum volume of water as in the existing water permit (U100803) of 925 cubic metres per day is proposed to irrigate this total area of 40.2ha of vineyard.

It is also proposed in this application to take water via an existing gallery located in an adjacent vineyard operated by Constellation Brands New Zealand Ltd (CBNZ) instead of taking water from the intake hole adjacent to their property as granted in U100804. The existing water meter #2350 and telemetry will be used to measure the water delivery to the BEL vineyard.

In summary, this application is for a new water permit which will replace U100803 for water to irrigate existing and adjacent land. As Council has commuted existing Class B water permits to Class A, the proposal is to take up to 925 cubic metres of Class A Wairau River water per day for the irrigation of 40.2ha of vineyard. Water is proposed to be taken from the Erina vineyard gallery operated by CBNZ.

The proposed take is within the allocation limit for Class A Wairau River water. The proposed use is based on the reasonable use requirements calculated using the water use model *Irricalc*.

The proposal is in accord with the objectives and policies of the Wairau/ Awatere Resource Management Plan (WARMP) and the Marlborough Environment Plan (MEP).

The adverse effects of this proposal will be minor and the proposal is consistent with the promotion of the sustainable management of natural and physical resources as set out in Section 5 of the Resource Management Act 1991.



2 Location

The parent property is located at 2280 State Highway 63, approximately 3.3km west of Loddon Lane. The legal description of the existing title is Lot 2 DP12169.

Subdivision U180214 has been approved to create Lot 1 of 5.488ha which is to be amalgamated with Lot 2 DP12169. The title plan for that is LT539379. It is expected that title for Lot 1 will issue in the next couple of months.

The accretion land lies to the north of Lot 1 LT539379 and east of Lot 2 DP12169. It is identified as: Crown Land Block I (under action) Avon Survey District.

The existing infiltration gallery that services the adjacent CBNZ vineyard and which is proposed also to be the source of this proposed water take, is located on paper road adjacent to Lot 1 DP483494 which is owned by Erina Downs Marlborough Ltd.

The general location of the site is shown on the plan in Appendix 1.

An aerial photograph in Appendix 2 shows the boundaries of the property to be irrigated, location of the CBNZ gallery and other relevant features of the site.

3 Site Description

The land on Lot 2 DP12169 and also Lot 1 of LT539379 has until recently been in pasture, but is now being developed into a vineyard. It is flat to undulating land, with an upper terrace on the southern quarter or so of the property and the balance on a lower terrace at the northern end.

The watercourses and associated wetlands on the lower terrace are identified in the Proposed Marlborough Environment Plan as part of significant wetlands (W209, W210 and W211). Some of the watercourses are likely to be the remnants of an old river braids. Vineyard development has been undertaken to avoid those wetlands and relevant setbacks from the wetlands have been created as a result of the process of the boundary adjustment subdivision U180214.

The accretion land also includes identified wetlands W209 and W211, is also of flat to undulating contour and is currently mainly pastoral/ cropping land.



4 Statutory Acknowledgements

Statutory acknowledgements are set out in the document Te Tau Ihu - Statutory Acknowledgements 2014.

Rangitane o Wairau, Ngati Rarua and Ngati Toa have noted cultural, spiritual, historical and traditional associations with the area.

To the applicant's knowledge there are no specific sites of cultural, spiritual, historical or traditional significance at or near the specific site of this proposal.

5 Proposal Detail

5.1 Water Take

It is proposed to take a maximum of 925 cubic metres of Class A Wairau River water per day up to a maximum of 74,973 cubic meters of per year from gallery #10162 located on paper road adjacent to Lot 1 DP483494.

5.2 Use of Water - Irrigation

It is proposed to use the water to irrigate 40.2ha of vineyard on Lot 2 DP12169, Lot 1 LT539379 and Crown Land Block I (under action) Avon Survey District as shown on the site plan in Appendix 2.

Water will be used to the maximum monthly volumes in accordance with the Irricalc model as follows:

The full Irricalc assessment sheet is found in Appendix 4.

5.3 Use of Water – Ancillary Purposes

Water is also proposed to be taken for ancillary purposes including in the non-irrigation season, such as for making up agrichemical sprays, wash-down water and irrigation line flushing.



The volume for this use is estimated at 4,020m³/yr which is in accordance with industry standards of 100m³/ha/yr.

6 Activity Status

6.1 Resource Management Act

Section 14 of the Resource Management Act 1991 (the Act) requires that (paraphrased), no person may take or use any water unless it is allowed by a regional rule or resource consent.

6.2 Wairau/ Awatere Resource Management Plan

The subject land is zoned Rural 4 in the Wairau/ Awatere Resource Management Plan (WARMP).

Water Take

General Rule 27.1.2.3.1 provides for abstractions between 10 and 500m³/day/site from a water resource other than the Wairau Aquifer as a discretionary activity.

Water Use

The Act requires that no person may use water unless expressly allowed in a rule in a regional plan. The only uses specifically provided for in the Plan are for domestic, stock, bore testing, firefighting and use from storage dams.

Section 87B of the Act determines that where Part 3 of the Act requires a resource consent, but where there is no relevant rule in a plan, the activity is to be dealt with as discretionary. The proposed use of water for irrigation is therefore a Discretionary Activity.

6.3 Marlborough Environment Plan

The land is in the Rural Environment zone in the Marlborough Environment Plan (MEP).

The water is to be taken from the Wairau River Fresh Water Management Unit (FMU).

Water Take

The water take is a discretionary activity in accordance with Rule 2.5.2.

Water Use

The use of the water is a discretionary activity in accordance with Rule 2.5.3.



7 Assessment

An overview analysis of the requirements of Schedule 4 of the Act is found in Appendix 7.

7.1 Actual & Potential Effects

Effects on Water Resources

No more water is proposed to be taken than is currently consented.

The allocation framework in the WARMP and the MEP are established on the basis of adverse environmental effects on the water resource being acceptable provided takes are within that framework. The proposed water take is within the allocation framework for Class A Wairau River water under both Plans.

Effects on Neighbourhood, Community

The water is proposed to be taken via an existing infiltration gallery #10162 located on paper road adjacent to Lot 1 DP483494. It represents only 10.6% of the maximum water already taken via this gallery for CBNZ. The nearest gallery is approximately 910m downstream. Given this separation distance there will not be any noticeable effects from this proposed take on the ability to take water from the neighbouring gallery.

Effects on the Locality, Landscape, Visual

The site is not noted as an outstanding natural feature or landscape in the Plans.

There will be no adverse effects of this water take and use on the locality, landscape or visual qualities of the area.

Effects on Ecosystems

No more water is proposed to be taken than is currently consented.

The proposed water take is within the allocation framework for Class A Wairau River water under both the WARMP and the MEP.

In essence, in setting water allocation limits, the Plan processes have determined that the adverse effects of abstraction within those limits will have acceptable effects on the water resource in terms of life supporting capacity, integrity of habitat, recreation and amenity values of the River.



Effects on Aesthetic, Recreational, Scientific, Historical, Spiritual, or Cultural Values

There are no particular aesthetic issues with this proposal and the site is not noted for any recreational values.

The site is not noted in the Plan as having any scientific or European historical significance.

While Rangitane o Wairau, Ngati Rarua and Ngati Toa have noted cultural, spiritual, historical and traditional associations with the area, to the applicant's knowledge there are no specific sites of cultural, spiritual, historical or traditional significance at or near the specific site of this proposal.

Effects of Discharge of Contaminants

No discharge of contaminants is proposed or will result from this proposal.

Risk Through Natural Hazards, Hazardous Substances, Hazardous Installations

No hazardous substances are involved with this proposal.

7.2 Objectives & Policies

An assessment of relevant objectives and policies in Wairau/ Awatere Resource Management Plan and the Proposed Marlborough Environment Plan is found in Appendix 6.

The proposal is in accord with those objectives and policies.

7.3 National Policy Statement

The National Policy Statement for Freshwater Management 2014 (NPSFM) seeks to stop Councils from over-allocating water resources and institute methods to phase out over-allocation.

The existing and proposed abstractions are within current allocations.

7.4 National Environment Standard

There are no National Environmental Standards that are relevant to this proposal.



7.5 Regulations

The Resource Management (Measurement and Reporting of Water Takes) Regulations 2010 requires water meter data to be provided in a form that is suitable for electronic storage.

The existing water meter that was used for the consented take point under U100803 will be used to meter the water take via gallery #10162. A data-logger and telemetry are installed.

7.6 Regional Policy Statement

I have reviewed this proposal against the provisions of the Marlborough Regional Policy Statement (RPS). There are no relevant matters in that document that have not already been covered by assessment of the objectives and policies of the WARMP.

8 Potentially Adversely Affected Persons & Consultation

There will not be adverse effects on neighbouring water abstractors. No other specific potential adverse effects have been identified. No consultation therefore is considered to be required or been undertaken.

It is accepted that, as this is an application for use of a public resource, the application will be publicly notified.

9 Conclusions

This application is for a water permit to replace existing water permit U100803 which is due to expire.

The crop being irrigated in this proposal has changed from arable crops and pasture to vineyard and the area to be irrigated is 40.2ha. However no more water is proposed to be taken than is currently consented under U100803.

There will not be adverse effects on neighbouring water abstractors.

The proposed take is within the allocation framework for water from the Wairau River in the WARMP and the MEP. The proposed use is based on the reasonable use requirements calculated using the water use model *Irricalc*.

The proposal is in accord with the relevant objectives and policies of statutory resource management plans.





3. Water meter #2350.


