Extra traffic combined with vehicles often exceeding the 50km/h imposed speed limit through town makes for a lack of both pedestrian and vehicle safety along Walking is uncomfortable due to a narrow footpath and a lack of safe pedestrian crossings at key spots such as the school and the community hall.

Growing Marlborough Opportunities


- Continue bicycle lane from Sh1 through town
- Introduce visual friction for drivers by narrowing vehicle lanes, introducing kerb build outs and designated parking.
- Formalise existing parking between the kerb build-outs and introduce a barrier between car parking and bicycle lane.



Other Opportunities


- Improve and enhance existing planting to reduce maintenance requirement and add to the "village" environment.
